History

We will be completing our work on 'Shopping' but looking at shops today, seeing how goods are paid for and packaged. We will complete our learning by the children answering our key enquiry question "How has shopping changed overtime?"


Geography

Using both maps and ariel photographs the children will be locating where we live. They will also create maps using classroom objects before drawing simple maps of the school grounds. Using these maps they will follow simple routes around the school.

English

Our key texts this half term are "Traction Man", "Beegu" and a film clip study of "The Snowman". They will talk about the sequence of events in these texts and retell these stories. They will also be answering questions to show their understanding of what has been read to them. The children will continue focusing on verbally constructing and then writing their own sentences. They will focus on using a capital letter, full stop and finger spaces independently. Through our daily phonics lessons, the children will be encouraged to apply their

Science

In Science, we will be continuing our work on materials. The children will build on the knowledge they've learnt so far to be able to sort objects based on their properties. They will also be carrying out some investigations to apply their knowledge and understanding of materials.

At the end of the half term, we will again go on a seasonal walk with our focus being winter. The children will be making observations of how plants change in different seasons.

PSHE (including RHE)

The theme for this half term is 'Celebrating differences'. The children will identify and discuss



what they have in common with each other. They will also discuss the differences they have and explore why differences make each individual unique and special. The children will have the opportunity to talk about their friends and families focusing on special or memorable examples of how they are similar yet different individually.

RE

As part of Harrow's RE curriculum, Year One will be looking at the question "Is it important to have a day that is different to other days?", with a particular focus on Christianity and Hinduism. They will learn about days such as Divali, Raksha Bandhan and Christmas.

Maths

This half term, the children will learn about number through place value and addition and subtraction activities. They will practise recognising and writing numbers. The children will also count objects to match and represent numbers. They will count forwards and backwards within 10 and 20 and will order numbers. The children will compare numbers using words greater than and less than, and will be introduced to the <,> and = symbols. In addition and subtraction activities they will be introduced to the part whole model with groups of objects. The children will explore number fact families and focus on addition facts for number bonds to 10. They will explore 2D and 3D shapes and develop vocabulary to talk about their properties.

Computing

This term the children will learn use the tools and activities in Purple Mash. They will explore pictograms and understand that data can be represented in a picture format. The children will learn to follow instructions and realise that following them in a set order leads to an end result.

PΕ

Our indoor sessions will focus on dance. Children will copy repeat and perform simple movement patterns in response to themes such as colours, animals and seasons.

Our outdoor session focus is send and return. The children will develop skill in sending an object using hand or bat. They will learn to send a variety of balls to a partner.

Music:

This half term, the children will be exploring the themes of weather and seasons. We will be learning about pitch, volume and using graphic symbols. We will use a variety of untuned and tuned percussion as well as using body percussion. We will be listening to Cuckoo from the Carnival of the animals and Beethoven's depiction of a storm from the Pastoral symphony.
