<u>English</u>

The children have thoroughly enjoyed Toby Alone by Timothee de Fombelle this half term thus we are excited to be continuing our work in Autumn 2. Throughout this next unit of work, children will explore the author's choice of language, structure and in particular the effect it has on the reader. They will be learning how to analytically

evaluate a text, which will aid their reading comprehension skills. Pupils will also use this adventure story as a stimulus for a range of formal writing genres. Pupils will also take part in SPaG lessons weekly.

We have had a great start to the year and your children have settled in incredibly well. If you haven't already done so, please sign up to your child's class dojo account so you can access their class story. These are updated regularly throughout the week.

The school target for attendance is 97%. Please make sure your child is in school everyday. Year 6's attendance this half term was: 96.6%

Early Learning: Children should aim to arrive at school for 8:35am when Early Learning begins. Missing just 15 minutes of learning each day = 2 full weeks of school each year!



SATs 2024

KS2 SATs will take place: Monday 13th - Thursday 16th May 2024. More details about this will be shared in our Meet the Teacher session.

In order to help your child revise for their SATs assessments we recommend you use the CGP books.

<u>Science</u>

This half term, children will be learning about animals, including humans. The children will be predominantly investigating the circulatory and digestive system and identifying the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood itself. The children will also be looking at how nutrients and water are transported in plants and animals. Finally, the children will learn about the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function.

Mathematics

This half term, children will continue to build on and strengthen their knowledge of the KS2 maths curriculum including securing number facts and relationships as well as practising their reasoning and problem solving skills. Children will first learn how to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions before deepening their understanding by solving fraction related problems. Finally, they will compare and classify geometric shapes based on their know properties.

Indoor: This half term, half of the year group will be taking part in Dance where they will learn the importance of balance, agility and collaboration. The other half will be having Yoga sessions where pupils will learn a range of postures as well as mindfulness techniques. Outdoor: Football: tactics and teamwork will be our focus.



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Geography - This half term, children will be focusing on foods produced around the world and the season(s) foods grow and thrive in. In addition, they will also examine the importance of fair trade foods, carbon footprints and food miles. Food Miles

<u>DT</u> - Our topic this half term is 'Plant based recipes'. We will evaluate and investigate a range of healthy, plant based foods and design a healthy, plant based food project.

<u>Music</u> - This half term's unit is Journeys. The theme of challenging journeys in life resonates through this selection of songs and pieces of music with thoughts of change and transition, and binds them in an optimistic and uplifting song cycle performance.

<u>MFL</u> - Pupils will be consolidating the language covered in previous years and learning how to talk about activities that they enjoy. They will be able to discuss what they did at the weekend and state their likes and dislikes.

<u>Computing</u> - As part of the computing curriculum, children will be using Purple

Mash to learn how to code using the PRIMM approach. We will also continue to learn about Online Safety.

RE - Que es Navidad?

The unit will look at The Christmas Story in depth and encourage children to look for differences and similarities in the two accounts within the Bible. The children will investigate traditions associated with celebrating Christmas both here and around the world.



PSHE (including RHE) - In this unit, children will be celebrating differences. They will be able to explain ways in which differences
