



learn to recognise the features of the text types

and plan and write them independently. Also, the

pupils will practice a variety of grammar, punctuation and spelling rules and concepts. Children will also explore the different questioning

techniques used in reading comprehensions as

well as tasks to help improve their vocabulary,


inference and retrieval skills.

The school target for attendance is 97%. Currently, our year group overall attendance is 96.5% so please continue to ensure your children are in school every day - we love winning the bears each week!






- planning different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions, including recognising and controlling variables where necessary,

Mathematics

During the second part of this term, children will be learning how to solve questions on: conversions, algebra, percentages and ratio. The will link their learning to place value and fractions and apply this learning when accurately solving problems. They will also interpret and construct pie charts and line graphs and use these to solve problems.



PE

Topic 1 - Indoor PE: Dodgeball.

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History

We will be looking at WW2 in more detail during this topic particularly focusing on The Battle of Britain and why this was a turning point in History. The children will also discuss: how and why war began; what life was like on the home front and how the local area was affected by war.

RE

This half term we will be following a new scheme of work for our learning in RE, Together the children will learn more about a variety of faiths such as Christianity, Judaism and Zoroastrianism when answering the question: Why is there suffering?



DT

This half term, pupils will be undertaking a very exciting project in DT - to design a brand new playground! They will need to include a variety of structures focusing on the designing and building process and then creating the surrounding landscape.



Music

Our topic for this term - Roots - provides a complete musical performance about the effects of the Slave Trade on a West African village. The integrated music features traditional Ghanaian songs and percussion rhythms and the infamous spider-man Anansi.

MFL

The children will be consolidating the language they have learned in the previous term. They will also learn the names of different foods in French.

As part of this unit, they will also learn key phrases that they can use to buy food in a shop.

PSHE (including RHE)

Our Jigsaw unit this term is: **Healthy Me.** This covers two main areas of health:

Emotional health (relaxation, being safe, friendships, mental health skills, body image, relationships with food, managing stress) and Physical health (eating a balanced diet, physical activity, rest and relaxation, keeping clean, drugs and alcohol, being safe, first aid) in order for children to learn that health is a very broad topic.
