Welcome to Summer One!

Welcome to the Summer Term! The children have all been working very hard and have enjoyed our learning so far this year. Please read on to see the exciting things teachers have planned for the next six weeks.

The attendance for Year 1 so far this year is 95.9% - well done, nearly there! Our target for attendance is 97%

Art

This half term. Year One will work creatively to explore techniques using paint and pastel in order to generate a space themed piece of art work. The children will explore pattern, line and colour to create a variety of planet shapes. They will develop skills in making a simple collograph and create a print by taking a rubbing. They will also learn to use paint to produce a planet themed mono print and will use this as part of a space themed picture. The children will explore space images and related artwork such as Van Gogh's Starry Night, Alexander

Calder's Sun with Planets.

How you can support your child at home:

- Visit the local library to choose some books to share at home.
- Read every night your reading books from School and your library book.
- Practise segmenting and blending pseudo words.
- Visit the National Geographic for Kids website to learn lots of interesting facts about animals. Videos (nationalgeographic.com)
- Practise coutning forwards and backwards to 100.
- Practise saying one more and one less than any given number to 50 aloud.

Computing

As part of their online safety learning, pupils will learn about 'Safety in my online mash neighbourhood'. Over this half term, the children will be creating their own programs by writing simple lines of code. The children will continue to learn about debugging throughout the half term and will solve problems with their programs by reading the codes they have created.

History

The children will continue learning about the moon landing. They will learn about the 1969 Moon Landing Astronauts and focus on Neil Armstrong and why he is

famous. At the end of our unit the children will be answering the enquiry question; "What was the moon landing, and why is it still remembered today?"

Science

The children will continue their work on Animals including Humans. We will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. The children will then apply all their knowledge on a fantastic trip to Paradise Wildlife Park. Next, the children will be looking at the

season of Spring. They will make be making observations of the changes they



can identify.

Music

The children will listen carefully to The Carnival of the Animals' by Camille Saint-Saens and will identify specific instruments that are representing animals. The children will be focussing on the tempo, counting and performing to a steady beat. The children will also be looking at and understanding pitch (high and low).







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English

This half term our books are, 'The Tale of the


Whale' by Karen Swann and 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. The children will be revising adding the suffixes ing, ed, er and est to root words where no spelling change is needed. In our writing we will be consolidating using capital letters and full stops. The children will learn how to add story language into their retell of the traditional tale "The Three Billy Goats Gruff".





PSHE (including RHE)

The children will explore the different relationships they have in and out of



RE

In RE this half term the children will be exploring a range of religious views to be able to answer the question, "How do we know that new babies are special." They will also be reflecting and drawing upon their own experiences within their family and community.

Maths

Year One will continue counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. They will revise doubles using numbers to 20. The children will begin to understand multiplication as 4x6=24 6x4=24 repeated addition and will begin to record this as an array. They will explore division through sharing objects into equal groups. They will start to develop an understanding of fractions through finding halves and quarters of shapes and groups of objects.
