
RE

The theme of our RE lessons will be 'Why is Water Symbolic?' Children will explore how water is used as a symbol in the Christian, Sikh, Muslim and Shinto faiths.

English

This half term, our English and Geography are closely linked. In class, we will be reading "The Vanishing Rainforest" by Richard Platt. It will introduce the children to new technical vocabulary and will be the inspiration for their own narrative stories. The children

will complete a range of writing activities such as adventure stories and a newspaper report. Grammar and punctuation activities will be completed on a daily basis and are linked to the learning and books the children will be reading and writing about.

Maths

This half term, children will learn to add and subtract fractions as well as find a fraction of an amount.

The children will also learn about money. They will learn to convert pound and pence as well as solving addition and subtraction problems involving money.

The children will also will learn about Time. They will learn how to tell time to the nearest minute on a digital and analogue clock.



Please ensure your child visits TT Rockstars and continue to rehearse their multiplication and division facts for the 3,4 and 8 times tables.

Art

This half term, the children will develop their drawing and painting skills through exploring the art work of the Brazilian artist Romero Britto. The children will learn about the importance of colour,



shape and texture. The children will learn how he creates his pictures, and then create their own versions inspired by his work.


Computing

French

In French, the children will how to speak about their family and we will look at the story, 'The Very Hungry



Caterpillar'. The children will learn how to say different foods along with key vocabulary from the story.



Home Learning

The children will continue to receive weekly English, Maths and spelling home learning which is set on a Friday on Class Dojo and is due in the following <u>Wednesday</u>. The children should be reading daily for at least 15 minutes and must write at least three comments a week into their reading diary. The children should also visit TT Rockstars where they can practice their times tables and division facts as well as MyMaths to complete online Maths activities linked to their learning in school.

Music

Indoor: During our indoor PE sessions, the children will be learning about athletics. The children will learn how to control their jumps, demonstrate agility and speed and learn to throw with speed, power and apply appropriate force.

Outdoor: During outdoor PE this half term, the children will be participating in a range of activities known as "Outdoor Adventure

Activities" (OAA). Through this, the children will work together, solve problems, discuss strategies, lead and follow others.



Geography

This half term, the children will learn about why rainforests are important to us. They will learn about the different layers, understand the importance of the rainforest for the world and the local environment, along with the impact humans can have. We will then compare the Amazon rainforest with the New Forest in the UK.

-take a walk in the park and try to identify the plants and flowers growing
