Autumn Term 2022—First Half



## English

This half term, the children will be studying, 'The Story of the Windrush', by K.N. Chimbiri. The children will be reading the text and completing a range of activities based on the story. Throughout this unit, the children will learn about the different features of writing and will apply them to their own work. Throughout the half term, they will cover a variety of text types: non-chronological report, informal letter and emotive poetry about the Windrush Generation. The children will also continue to develop their reading skills and grammar knowledge. Guided reading lessons will be taught using VIPERS reading skills (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summary).



## RE

As part of Harrow's R.E. Curriculum, the children will focus their learning on Hinduism and will complete a unit entitled, "What do you know about Hinduism?" They will learn more about Hindu Gods, how Hindu people worship, and how they celebrate.



## History

Our history topic this term will focus on different aspects of Anglo-Saxon life. They will learn about why the Anglo-Saxons invaded and settled; gain an understanding of how place names still used today were devised by the Anglo-Saxons; study different Anglo-Saxon artefacts and learn about the discovery and significance of the Sutton Hoo. Finally, they will explore village life and how the Anglo-Saxons were responsible for the development of Christianity in Britain.

Attendance target is 97%.


## Library

Our school is very proud of the library which is a fun and engaging learning environment. In the coming weeks, children will be able to select a book, weekly, from the school/class library.




## Mathematics

In Year 5, children will continue to develop their mathematical skills. This half term, they will focus on place value and addition and subtraction. Pupils will learn to read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1,000,000 and determine the value of each digit. They will also interpret negative numbers in context and count forwards and backwards with positive and negative numbers. It is really important that children in year 5 are developing a quick recall of their times tables up to 12x12 because this knowledge will help them in all areas of maths.



## Science

The children will be learning about life cycles. Through this unit of work, the children will explore the life cycles of different animals and plants. They will learn how plants and animals reproduce and will be able to understand the differences between them. The children will also study the work of eminent scientists and how their work has helped in the world of science.

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## Computing

In this unit, the children will develop their understanding of computer programming. The children will create a range of animated games using the skills acquired around coding.



## Modern Foreign Language—French

This half term, the children will be revising work from Year 4 and improving their conversational skills. They will be revising telling the time in French, and asking and giving their opinion about different lessons in school.



## PE

There will be outdoor and indoor PE lessons each week. Your child will be expected to come to school in their full PE kit on their PE days.

Outdoor PE: The children will develop specific netball skills like pivoting, dodging and bounce passing so they can begin to play efficiently.

Indoor PE: The children will participate in gymnastics where they will concentrate on symmetry and asymmetry to create a sequence.



## PSHE (including RHE)

This half term, the children will be learning about 'Being Me in the World'. They will be able to explain the difference between direct and indirect bullying, describe the different dreams of young people from different cultures and understand the importance of e-safety.

Linking in with our history for this half term, the children will be learning how to design and make a money container inspired by those used in the Anglo-Saxon era.



## Music
