## Sunbeams

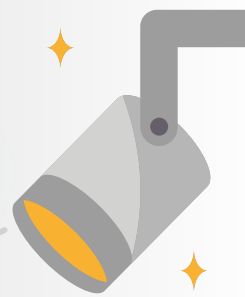
Sunbeams, our ARMs unit may not be open, but the children are still having a great time learning. Here they are all working collaboratively.

## Transition to Year 1

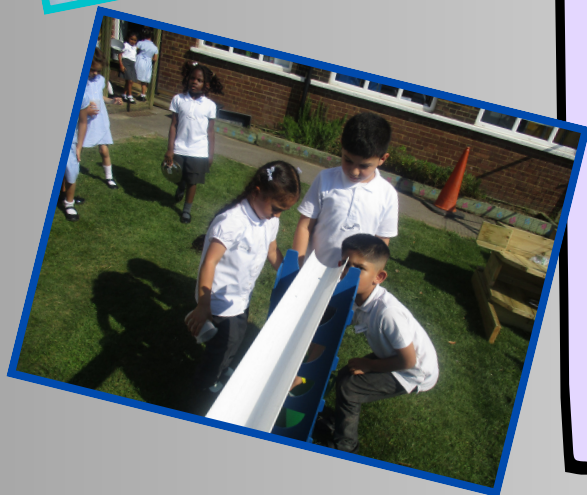


Moving into Year 1 is a big step in our pupils' educational journey at Stanburn. Our aim is to make it a smooth and positive experience for every child.

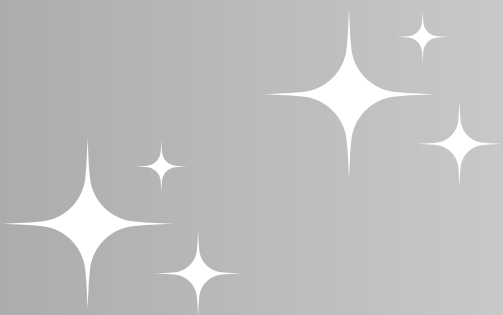


### My favourite photo of the week.
