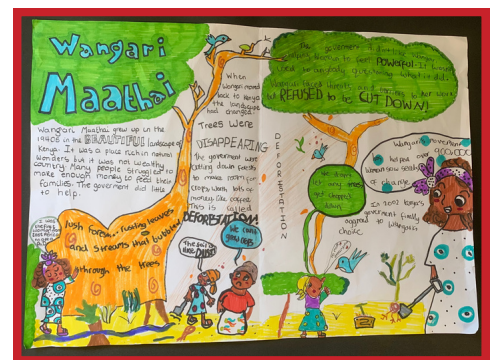
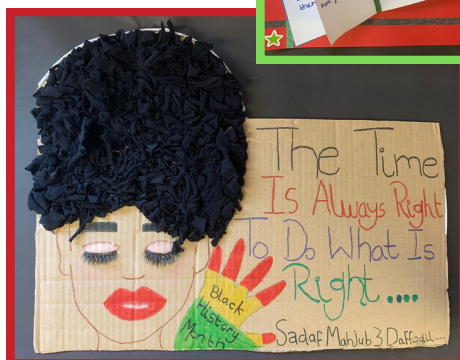
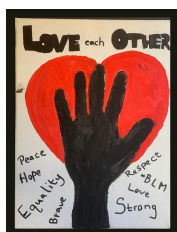
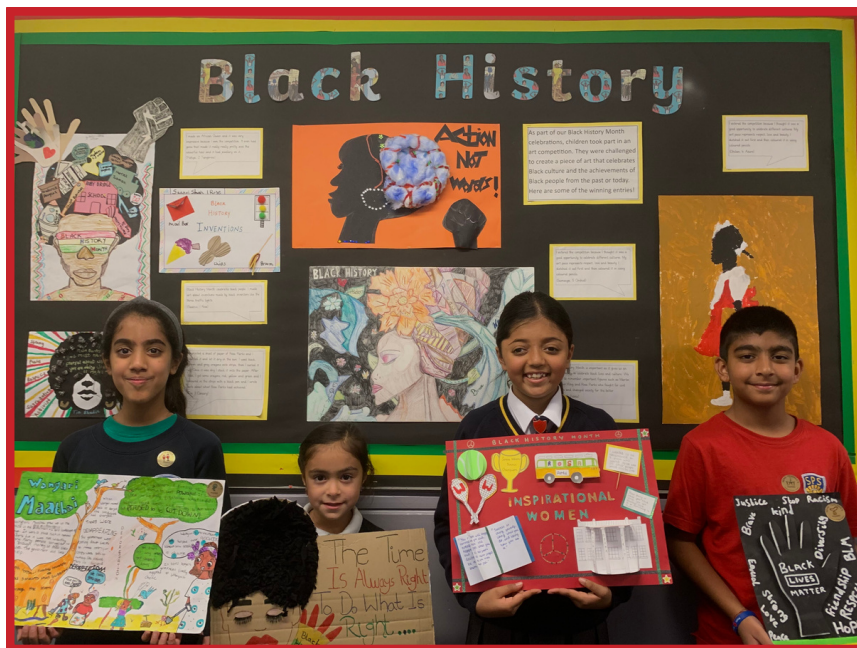


Black History Competition Winners
