

### We did:

We have taken into account feedback from our parent survey (Jan 2025) and have arranged '**Transition workshops**' for all year groups in June as a way of providing parents some insight and information about pupil's new year groups.

As part of the workshop, parents have the opportunity to watch a live lesson, there will be a briefing led by senior leadership to signpost parents to key curriculum information and a further opportunity to speak with staff at the 'Parent Consultation- drop in session' in July to help answer any further questions.

*Unfortunately, these won't be recorded but the slides will be shared with any parents unable to make the sessions as the emphasis of these sessions is on the content of the next year group's curriculum not individual teaching.*

## 2. Uniform Update

### 3. Home Learning

The Guidance and Expectation document for Home Learning was updated earlier on in the year and outlines Stanburn's approach to homework across the school.

Guidance & Expectations 2024-2025 : Home Learning



#### Home Learning at Stanburn Primary School

Home Learning at Stanburn Primary School is uploaded to Class Dojo by teachers every Friday. Children complete their written home learning in their green 'Home Learning Books' and return these to school by Wednesday. There is no expectation for 'talk' homework to be recorded in green Home Learning Books and no expectation for MyMaths or TTRS work to be recorded in books either.

Home Learning is set in Maths, English and Reading and gives children the opportunity to consolidate their learning from the week. No home learning is set during the holidays in order to allow the children to have a break (apart from in Year 6). However, daily reading is expected to continue during the school holidays with regular parental support.

*If pupils complete their learning before the Wednesday deadline, they may keep their book in their trays to save pupils bringing the book to and from school daily.*

*Home learning is not generally differentiated as it focuses on learning which has taken place that week which all pupils would have accessed. Work e.g. spellings may however be differentiated from pupils who are:*

- Working below the year group curriculum
- Pupils who are EAL or new arrivals.

Pupils from Year 3-6 have the opportunity to attend a **Home Learning Club** which takes place each Monday lunchtime. This is a time for pupils who perhaps need additional support or need to access ipads/laptops to come and complete their learning. Class teachers will signpost pupils to attend who they feel would benefit from this.

## Marking Home Learning:

Home Learning is reinforcement of learning carried out in class. It is expected that if a child struggles with the work, the parent will support them as much as they can. Therefore, staff will not assess a child's learning solely based on the work produced at home. In Reception and Key Stage 1, home learning will be checked by staff and will be acknowledged with stamps, stickers or a tick. Any areas children have found difficult will be addressed in further lessons or with children in a small group or on a 1:1 basis depending on the need.

In Key Stage Two, teachers will mark homework with the children by sharing exemplar answers and they will take opportunities to model how to solve questions. Children will peer or self-mark the homework and any mistakes or misconceptions will be explained.



## 8. Enrichment


We are very proud of the amazing array of enrichment opportunities on offer here at Stanburn Primary School from class trips, in school experiences and workshops, guest speakers to sports competitions, STEM enrichment and a huge range of visits linking to Stanburn's 5 for 5 cultural capital offer... we never seem to have a 'quiet' week!

Inevitably, this does mean that some pupils may miss learning taking place in class. However, each class has a teaching assistant who can be utilised to either pre-teach or catch up pupils who have been absent for any reason. Also, we have a robust QLA and intervention system which quickly highlights any gaps in pupil knowledge. In addition, where possible, enrichment activities are planned for PM sessions so core subjects can be taught in the AM in order to keep disruption to key learning to a minimum.

## 9. 'Last Minute' Events

As a school we understand everyone has commitments and busy lives so we do our best to give as much notice as possible when parents are required to attend events or alter their pick up and drop off plans.

However, we are a large school with many moving parts and we always consider all possible options before informing parents of plans and in a time of economic unease, we must also consider the financial implications of running events e.g. transport and staffing or cover costs. As a result, from time to time parents may be asked to pick up or collect their children if they would like them to attend different events. Also, we often have to work with other schools, services and leaders and our timeline is sometimes impacted by the response we have from others. We don't spring things on parents on purpose – we promise! We thank you for your co-operation.



**Taxi costs** – 6 seater taxi to Bannisters stadium £80 one way

**Mini bus (max 14 pupils)** – requires 1 member of staff to drive and must be booked 2 weeks in advance to utilise the mini bus scheme. Limited number of buses available and they are allocated on a first come, first served basis.

**Coach (14 pupils+)** – Approx £350 for a return trip to Harrow Arts Centre

**Supply teacher costs** – Approx £225


# CLASS SHUFFLES
