

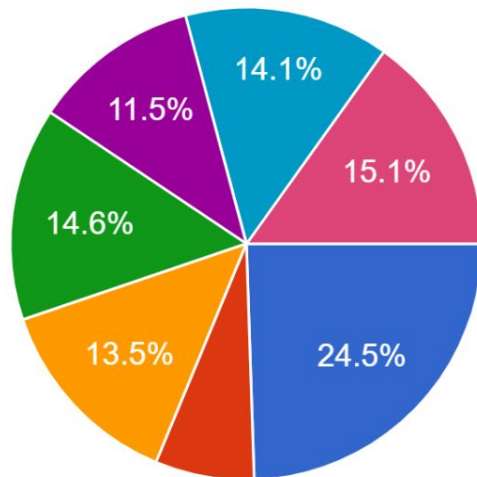

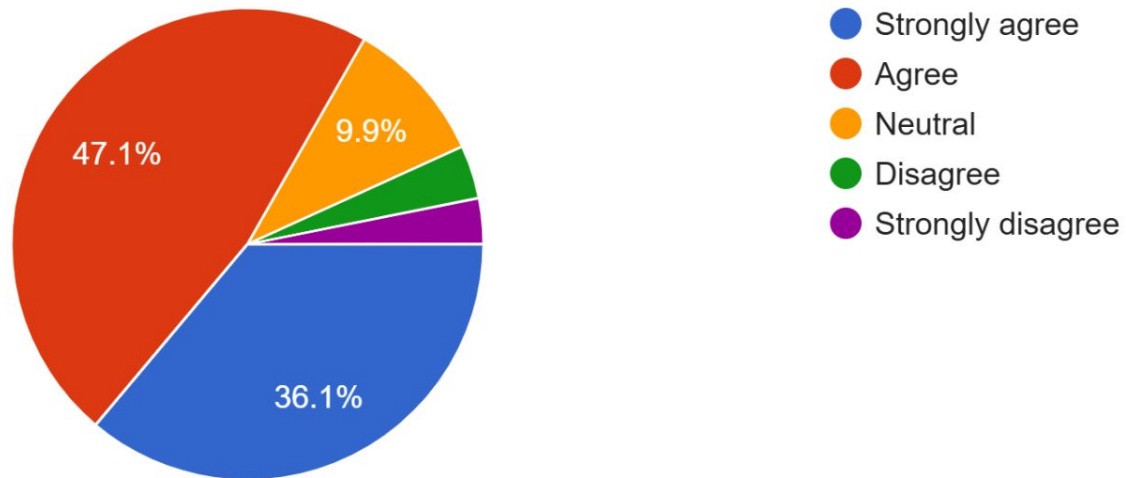

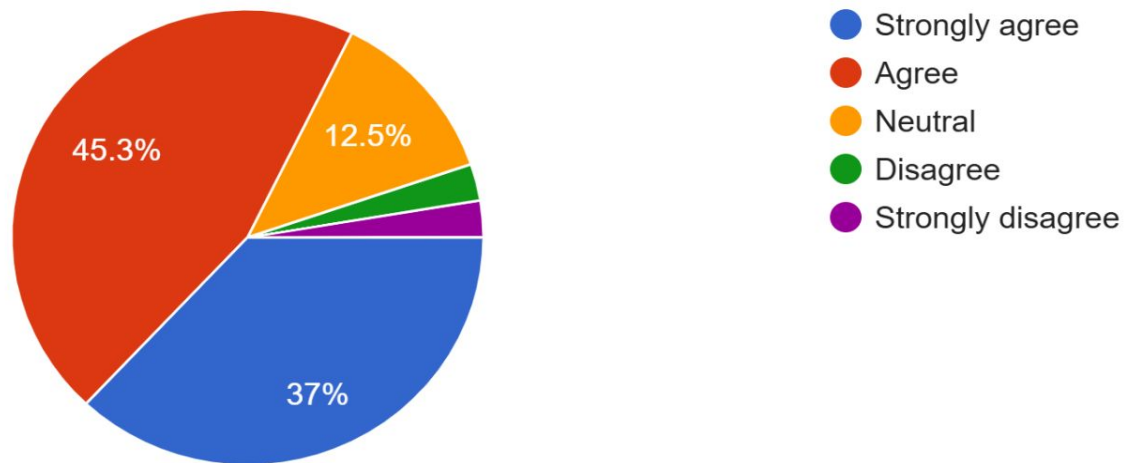
Quality of Education Teachers provide a clear picture of my child's progress and areas for improvement

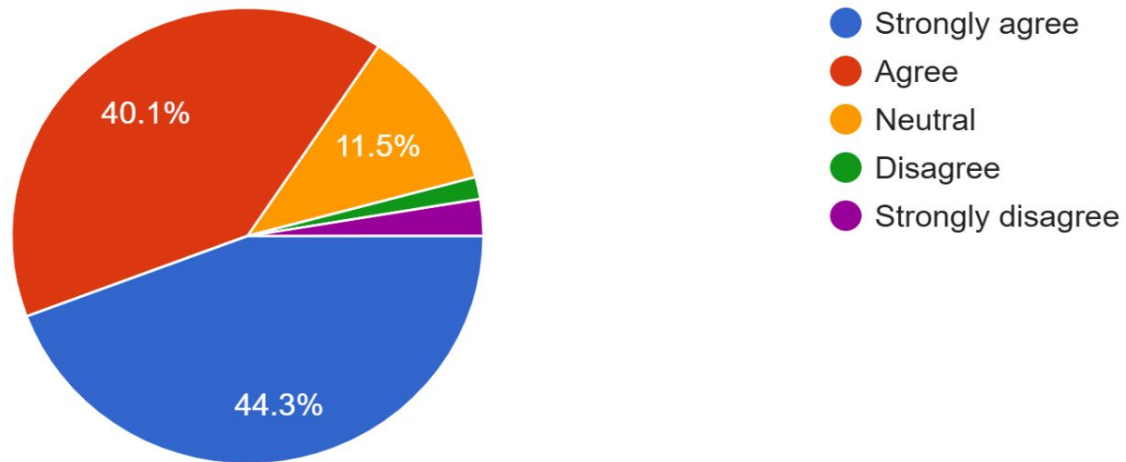
Quality of Education Stanburn Primary School provides appropriate support for my child to achieve their full potential.

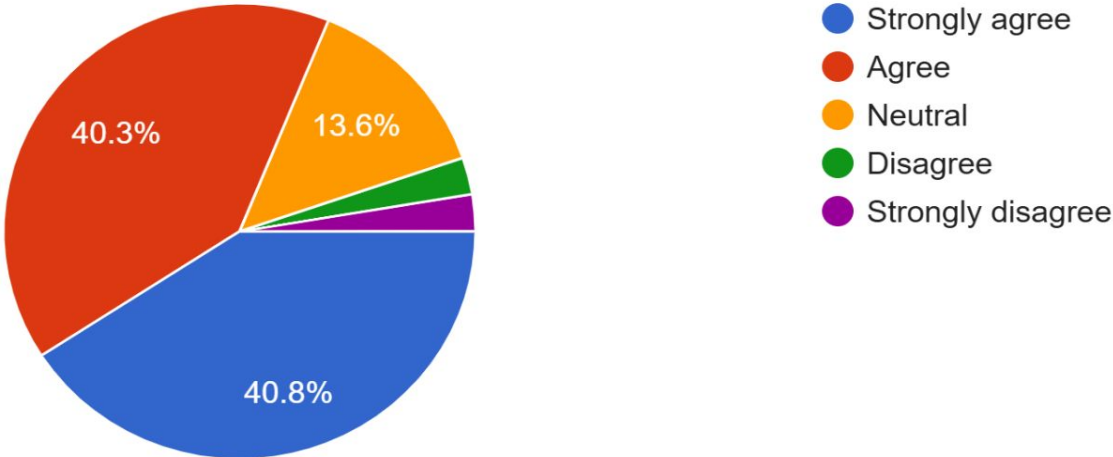
Behaviour and Attitudes My child feels safe and supported in school

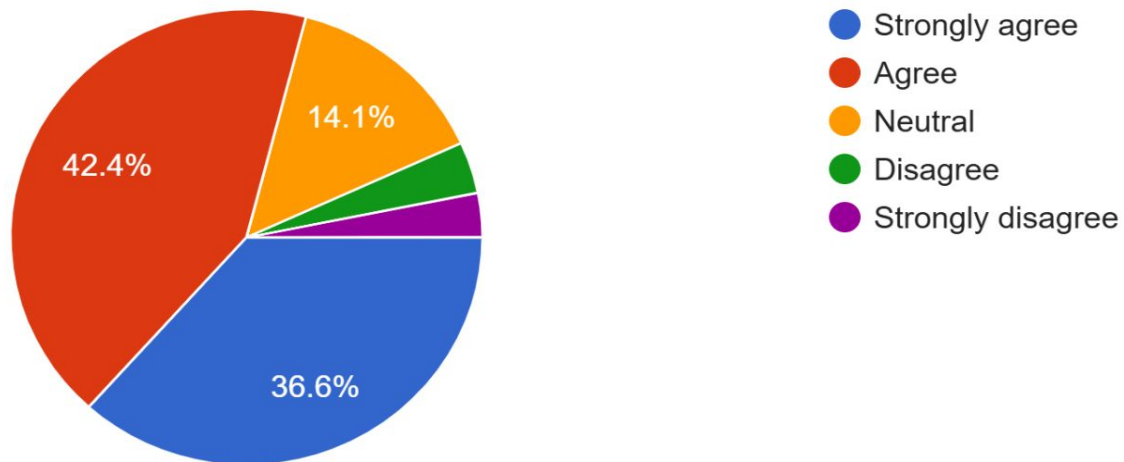
Personal Development Stanburn offers a wide range of opportunities for extracurricular activities or enrichment experiences for my child.

What do you feel are the school's strengths?

- There is an inclusive, safe, supportive environment for the children.

What do you feel the school could do better?

- Improve the technology at Parents' Evening
 - ◆ We agree, it did not work well this time, but has before. Spring Parents' Evenings will take place in person and we are looking into what went wrong with the online system and how we can prevent this next Autumn.
- Could communication be streamlined?
 - ◆ We send out one daily email to the whole school with other emails for individual year groups. With a big school, unfortunately there is a lot of communication.
- Could there be more lunch variety?
 - ◆ We have a very small kitchen and so can only offer 3 options each day. We also have to have a menu that the majority of children will like, so can't offer dishes that are too niche.
- Could we offer more clubs for Reception?
 - ◆ We now have 7 clubs open to Reception aged children
- ParentPay is not fit for purpose
 - ◆ We sympathise and are planning to move to Arbor in April 2025
- More play equipment in the playgrounds
 - ◆ Noted, we will ask Pupil Parliament what they want and order it.
- Children's toilets are in poor condition
 - ◆ The toilets are cleaned more than once a day, but some children have poor toilet etiquette, which we are working on. We are in consultation with Harrow to refurbish all our toilets, so watch this space.
