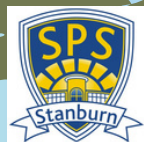


PUPILS PARLIAMENT UPDATES

Following feedback from last month's music lesson research, Years 5 and 6 enjoyed the launch of Stanburn-oke, a new initiative giving children the chance to perform songs of their choice, either as a soloist or in a group. Overall Summary
