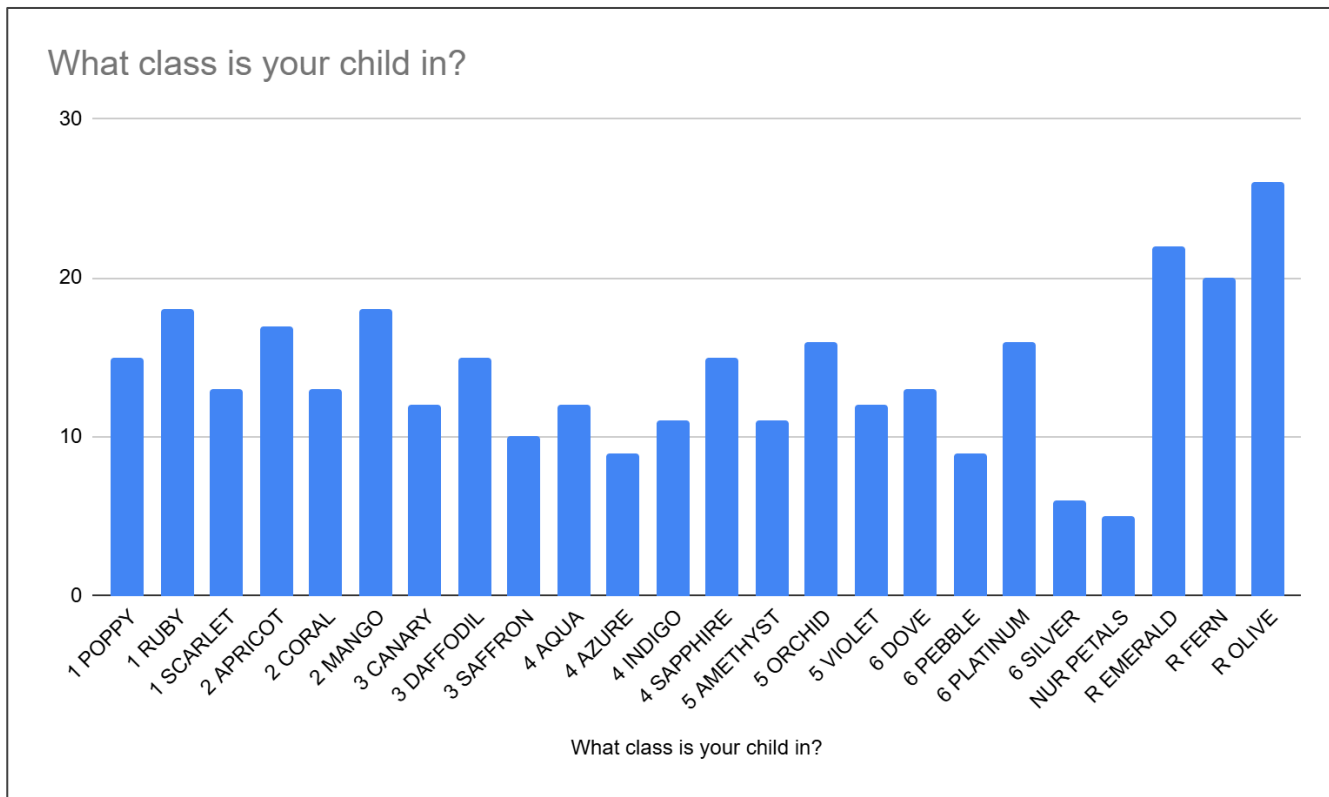

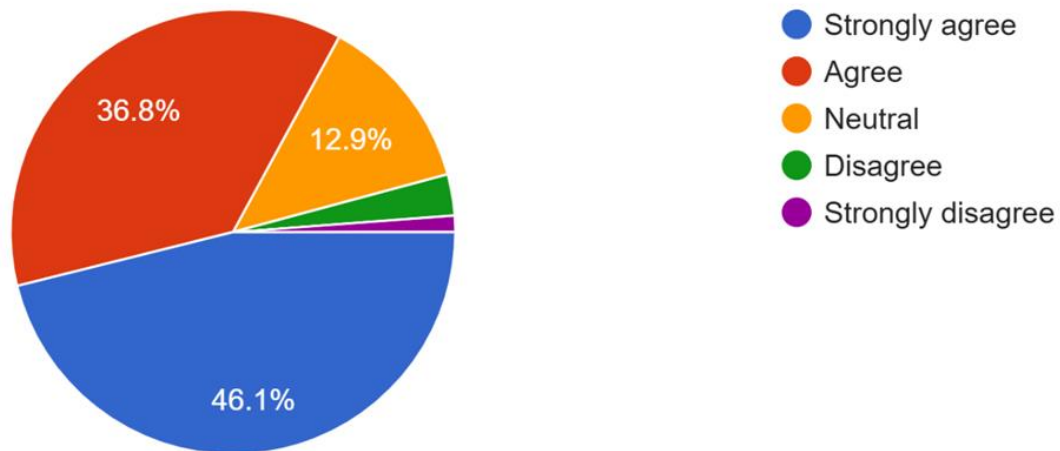


Breakdown of responses



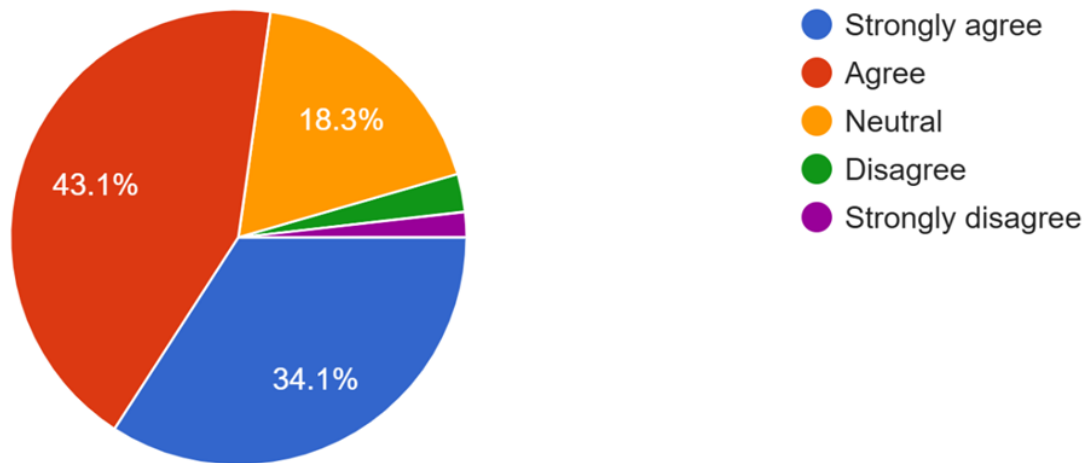
The school offers a wide range of additional activities/clubs for my child to participate in.

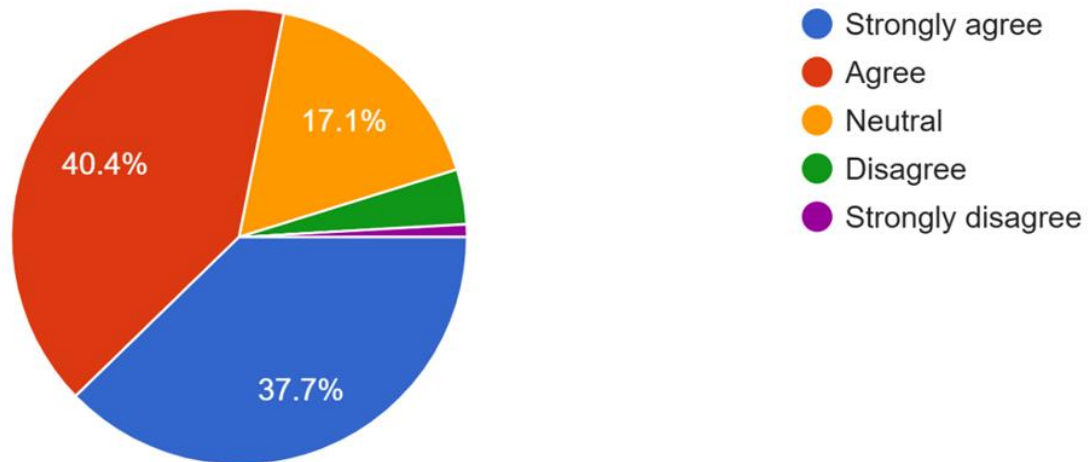
My child has the opportunity to enter into competitions in different areas e.g. art, music, poetry, poster creation, rap battles etc

The school offers a broad range of trips out and visitors in to enrich my child's learning.

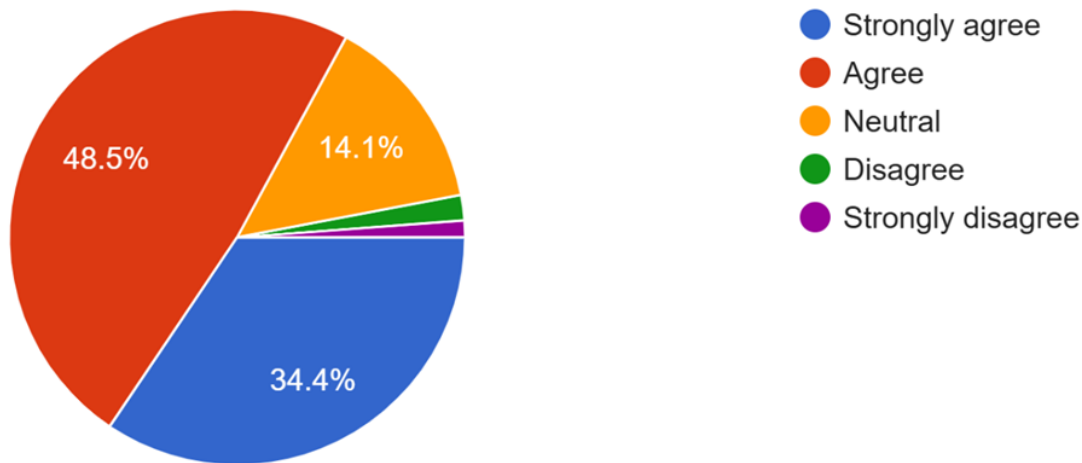

My child learns personal, social and emotional skills through the PSHE offer and themed days and weeks such as Gratitude Day, Mental Health Week, Parliament Week etc

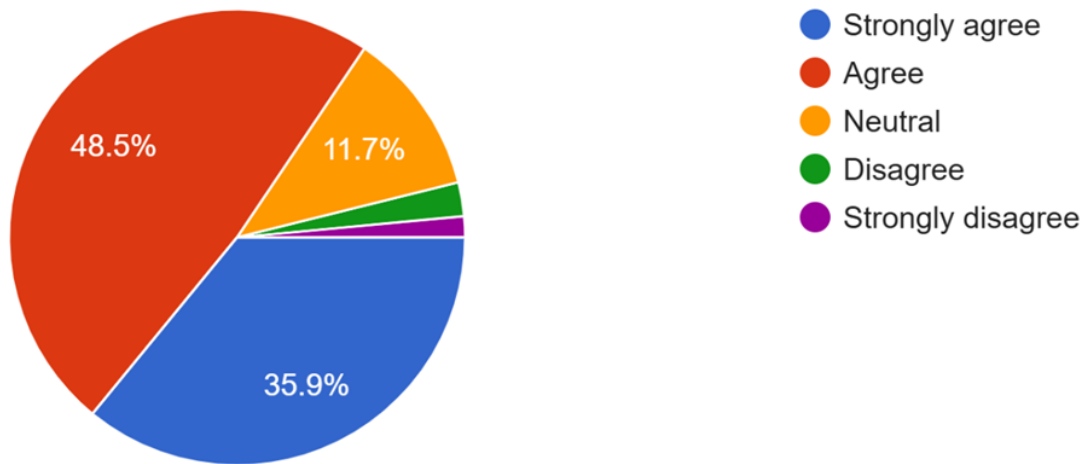

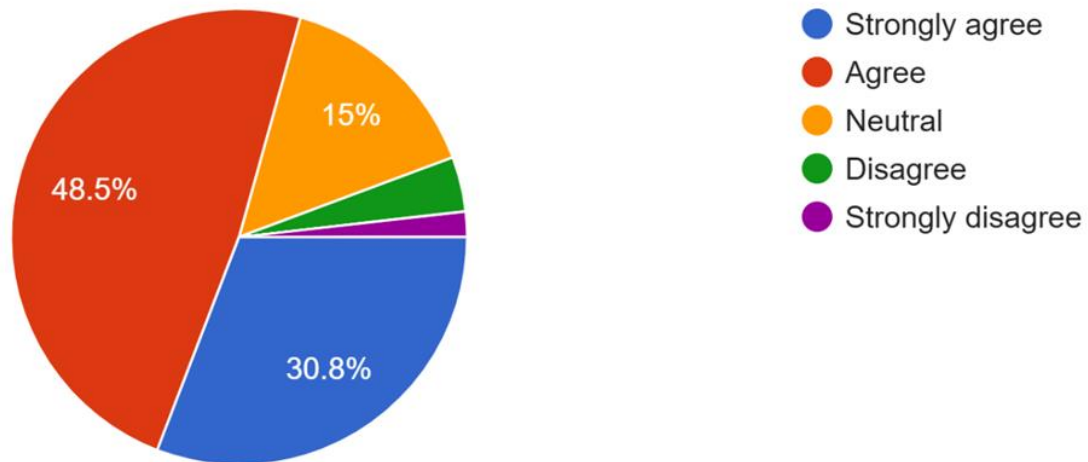
The school cares for my child's wellbeing with support from teachers, TAs and the Pupil Wellbeing Mentors (Mrs Adamson and Miss Wright).

Parental Feedback

- Some parents feel poor behaviour choices are on the increase.

The school has carried out additional training with staff and has organised parent workshops to discuss how we can work together to deal with poor behaviour choices. Our approaches to tackling behaviour have been adapted to take into account some of the behaviours we are now observing.

- More clubs especially more free clubs

In the spring term, we are offering 32 clubs a week with just under a third of them free. We regularly ask Pupil Parliament what new clubs they would like and try to source these.

- More sporting opportunities

We will look into how we can accommodate this, especially as the weather improves.
