Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

ALL pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

For this academic year we are delighted again to be able to use the PE sport premium to support the development of PE and school sport. As intended, we have used this funding to improve the provision of school sport at Stanburn Primary School, encourage participation in a range of sports, increase competition and promote a healthy lifestyle. We believe in a whole school approach to the development of sport and physical activity for all and we encourage all children to develop their understanding of the way in which they can use equipment and apparatus safely yet imaginatively to achieve their personal goals. We have also used our PESP money this year embed our aim of providing equal opportunities for all and ensure more **girls are engaged in PE, Sport and Physical Activity and to develop and promote diverse role models for the future**

Using the medium of sport we aim to increase their self-esteem and encourage pupils to become deep, flexible, creative thinkers.
The PESP funding has been used to develop this.

Key achievements to date until July 2024:

- Numerous inter-school competitions entered this year including: Chess, Netball, Boys' Football, Girls' Football, Athletics, Boys' Cricket Girls' Cricket, Rugby League, Rounders, Multi-sports, Basketball and Tag Rugby.
- A, B and C teams entered into competitions with other schools.
- Year 4 Girls' Football team won their league and were awarded with winners' medals.
- Year 5 and 6 Boys Football Team won their league and we were awarded the Harrow Shield.
- Year 5 and 6 Mixed Netball Squad came second in the borough and we were awarded runners' up medals.
- 5 successful Sports Days run across two days for all pupils in the school including Sunbeams (our ARMs unit) officiated and organised by Stanburn staff and Year 6 Sports Crew.
- Pupil voice playground survey undertaken to help drive improvement of our break times and play times. As a result of this, new equipment has been purchased for all year groups.
- Year 6 Playground Buddies have received training and Buddy 'equipment' cupboards have been restocked and organised.
- Further improvement in after-school club provision for pupils at the school. We have clubs led by internal and external agencies including: Multi-sports, Dodgeball, Cricket, Chess, Football (Boys + Girls), Netball, Ballet, Hip Hop, Basketball and Yoga.
- Bikeability course was provided free of charge for 30 pupils in Year 6.
- Weekly celebration of PE superstars posted on Class Dojo to celebrate non-academic success.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Continue to improve our extra-curricular provision for September 2024 including launching new clubs e.g. Fencing.
- School Gym due for installation in the Summer Holidays 2024. Ensure that this new provision is planned carefully into our school PE curriculum.
- Continue to replace team kits which are no longer fit for purpose and purchase new kits for teams which currently are without the correct kit e.g. Athletics squad, Basket Ball Team, Cricket Squad.
- Improve active travel opportunities for pupils at Stanburn.



- Celebrations of Monster Kickabout National Football Week and the FA's Let Girls' Play Biggest ever Football Session:



- Stanburn Primary School came in first place in Harrow's Street Tag Competition and featured in the local news and on a national podcast as a result.
- Fit4Life Harrow member again for 2023 -2024.
- A PE Review of the Year was created to showcase all of our hard work and success across the year in PE and School Sport:

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport.

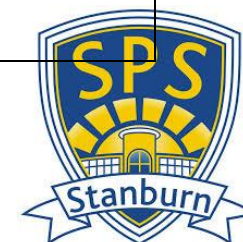
Stanburn Primary School received **£22,502.04** of funding during the academic year 2023-2024. Below is a breakdown of how funding was spent this year and its impact:

This included: Athletics sessions at Bannisters Stadium, Netball and Rounders Fixtures at local schools, Multi-sports competitions, Tag Rugby Festivals, Cricket tournaments held at Middlesex County Cricket Ground in Harrow and Basket Ball competitions.  <p><i>Year 6 pupils competing at Bannisters Stadium.</i></p>	<p>4 and 5.</p>  <p><i>Year 5 and 6 boys training before their fixture at The Hive Barnet FC's Football Stadium.</i></p>

<p>Subscription to the PE Hub Planning Tool: £380</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The profile of PE at Stanburn has been increased as staff have a comprehensive online planning tool to help them to teach the PE across the curriculum. - New sports have been added which has helped us to update and improve our curriculum e.g. dodgeball and golf. - PE Hub have also launched their new assessment platform which we will be able to utilise as a school. 	<p>1, 2 and 3.</p>
<p>Sovereign Design Play Systems: £24590.29</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Design and installation of a new children's health and wellbeing package 15 x pieces of outdoor gym equipment for pupils to use during break time, lunch time and during PE lessons. This will teach life skills and healthy habits which pupils can take through with them into high school and beyond. - This also includes all-weather surfacing of the existing trim-trail so it can be used come rain or shine. - Package also includes lesson plans and teacher resources to increase the confidence of non-specialist staff. 	<p>1, 2, 3, 4 and 5.</p>
<p>PE Equipment: £6475.79</p>  <p><i>Children at Stanburn have the opportunity to attend weekly chess sessions and then enjoy playing this at lunch time on the playground.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Equipment was purchased to broaden children's participation in a wide range of sports such as: basketball (basketball posts and balls ordered), additional tag rugby belts due to the increased interest in the sports since it was launched last year and new gymnastics equipment such as a beam, springboard and crash mat. - These sports have been introduced and interwoven into PE lessons in order to allow pupils at Stanburn to develop a love for a broader range of sports. Equipment was also purchased (such as draught boards, chess sets and return balls) to help improve break and lunchtimes for pupils following a pupil voice survey.
